OUR SCHOOLS

About TFGS Kohlu



Dr. Zafar Qadir - the then Political Agent and head of the district government in Kohlu (Balochistan) during 1989-90 conceived the idea of launching an English medium, co-education, modern educational institution in the foothold of the Marri tribe to combat poverty and crime through education. It has strength of over 500 students.

The journey of success has been fruitful for this school. The school comprises of 28 classrooms, library, computer room, science room and a number of on-campus staff residences.



TFGS Loralai

TF Grammar School Loralai is located at 240 kilometers from Quetta and 350 kilometers from Multan. It comprises 30 classrooms, science lab, computer room, administration block and an independent hostel for teachers. The district is well connected by road with DG Khan and Quetta.

TFGS Zhob

The model of Taaleem Foundation Grammar School was replicated in Zhob in the year 1991 after establishing the first school in Kohlu. The property for the school was donated by a family trust - Asad Memorial Trust. Additional construction was completed through the support from generous community leaders

such as Jaffar Khan Mandokhail. Today, the facility is able to accommodate 600 students.

The school comprises of 20 classrooms, multipurpose hall, library, computer center, dispensary and adequate staff residences.

About TFG's Mastung



The effort of developing new schools by Taaleem Foundation was further extended to Mastung in 1994, where Orya Maqbool Jan Abbasi - the then Deputy Commissioner Mastung offered to bring his brainchild "Sarawan Public School" in the folds of Taaleem Foundation. The school was brought in to the system of Taaleem Foundation and since then has been one of the most important schools of the chain; since it is the only English medium school in the district.

The school comprises of 18 classrooms, auditorium, library, science lab, computer room and a separate administration block. New staff residences have recently been added.

About TFG's Pishin

Taaleem Foundation established a branch in the District of Pishin in the year 1994. The school was established immediately after the control of the building was transferred to the foundation. The school has the capacity to accommodate over 500 students.

The school is equipped with the best educational facilities such as computer laboratory, library, science labs, etc. The school has completed 19 years of providing quality education to the residents of Pishin. The building has 14 classrooms, a staff room and a multipurpose hall.



About TFG's Muslim Baagh



Taaleem Foundation established a school in Muslimbagh in the year 1993. The school has the capacity to accommodate 500 students and is equipped with the latest facilities. The school has produced satisfactory results for over a decade now and is considered to be one of the strongest schools of the Taaleem Foundation chain in terms of operations and academics. The school was constructed with the aid provided by Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA).

The school has 20 rooms to impart knowledge to the students. It also consists of a computer lab and an independent teachers' hostel.

About TFG's Sui

The school was established in Tehsil Sui of District Dera Bugti in the year 1994. With the support from Nawab Akbar Khan Bugti, the school was established to provide quality education.

Pakistan Petroleum Limited Welfare Trust played a vital role in developing the school and till date is one of the major partners of Taaleem Foundation.

It has also donated over 1 million US dollars in order to construct a vocational training center exclusively to economically empower women. It comprises of 25 classrooms, multipurpose hall, staff room, science lab, computer lab and teachers' hostel.



About TFGS Killa Saifullah

Taaleem Foundation Grammar School opened up a branch in Killa Saifullah in the year 1992. The school has the capacity to accommodate 800 students. The facility was developed through the support of the local government, the community and through the generous support from Japanese International Cooperation Agency (JICA).

The school is one of the biggest schools of the chain when it comes to accommodate students.

The school is housed in a customized building constructed with the Japanese assistance. The present premises have 24 classrooms, computer lab, dispensary and adequate accommodation for staff.

AN OVERVIEW

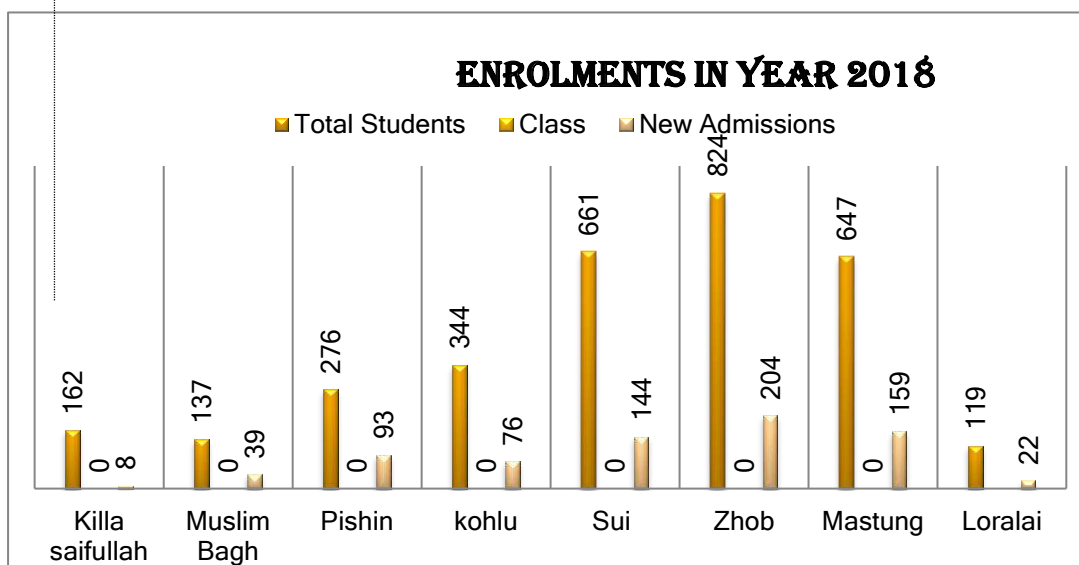
Taaleem Foundation Grammar Schools start their New Year academic session every year in March. In 2018 TFGs also started its session in the month of March after winter vacations. All station schools enjoyed winter vacation for two months. Except TFGS Sui re-opened in the mid of the January, while rest TFGS's opened in March. Distinct weather conditions have made the difference for the reopening of TFGS Sui.

1.1 Enrollments in the year 2018

TFG schools encouraged parents to admit their children's in the year 2018. At the start of the New Year, 2018, total 634 new students got enrolled. Mastung & Pishin School registered 159 & 144 new admissions which are a good score among all the station schools. New admissions are the proof that TFG schools are working hard and efficiently to up rise the schools among the competitors.

Whereas, Mr. Shahbaz got benefits in Pre-medical, Mr. Irfan in ICS and Wasila got No tuition fee in the current class. TFGS teachers are working deliberately on the students to get excellent results.

1.3 Educational Trips

TFG Schools arranged various educational trips throughout the period of last year 2017. During the first half of the year 2018, TFG school also exhibit few educational trips. On 29th April 2018, TFGS Muslim Bagh organized an educational trip to Judicial Complex Kila Saifullah. TFGS Syndicate's member Magistrate Mr. Ihtaram ul Haq has made this trip possible with his continuous support and effort. Honorable Magistrate along with his team welcomed warmly to our students of 6-8th grades. Students were briefed regarding different rules, regulation & procedure to promote the justice, peace, harmony & tolerance.

1.4. AFAQ Tarbiyah Scholars Camp

From 15th April to 17th April 2018, AFAQ held a 3day camp "AFAQ Tarbiyah Scholars Camp" at TFGS Zhob and on 17th August 2018 in TFGS Muslim Baagh. Objective of the camp was to train the students through Lectures and activities on different traits of life i.e. Personality Development, Time Management, Character Building, Power of Leadership, Self Confidence, Seerat.un.Nabi, Meaning full life. Students from other schools also participated in this camp. At the end of the camp certificates to 21 participants were distributed among the students. Four girls' participants of TFGSs will be master trainers to train further 10 students of TFGSs.



1.5. Major Academic Achievements

On April 30, 2018, Prize distribution ceremony regarding distinctions after completing the studies from TF, was organized at TFGS Pishin. Chief guest Captain Majid distributed the prizes among these achievers by awarding a laptop to our alumni Ms. Najeeb, he passed the FBISE SCC examination with highest marks.



TFGS Sui & TF Pishin won 8 Medals in HRAC "Art and Creative Writing contest-2018". A number of prominent schools like Sadiq Public School, Beacon House Public School, The City School, PAF Sargodha, Army Burn Hall School, Cadet

College Chand Bagh, Allied Schools, Pak Turk Schools, APACs, and DPS Schools etc were a part of this competition. Total of 2699 entries were received from all over Pakistan. Students of TFGS Sui have won 7 medals; 2 Gold Medals (Abdul Muqsit- Grade 2 & Mehtab -Grade 1), 4 Silver Medals (Hijab Fatima-Grade 5, Jewa Sadiq Grade 8, Muntaha Grade 2 & Yasir Grade 2) & 1 Bronze Medal (Zeeshan Grade 1). PAKISTAN”




Figure 4 Pakistan Resolution Day

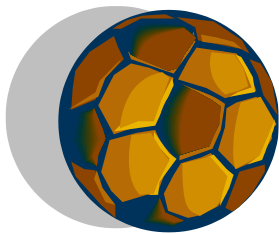

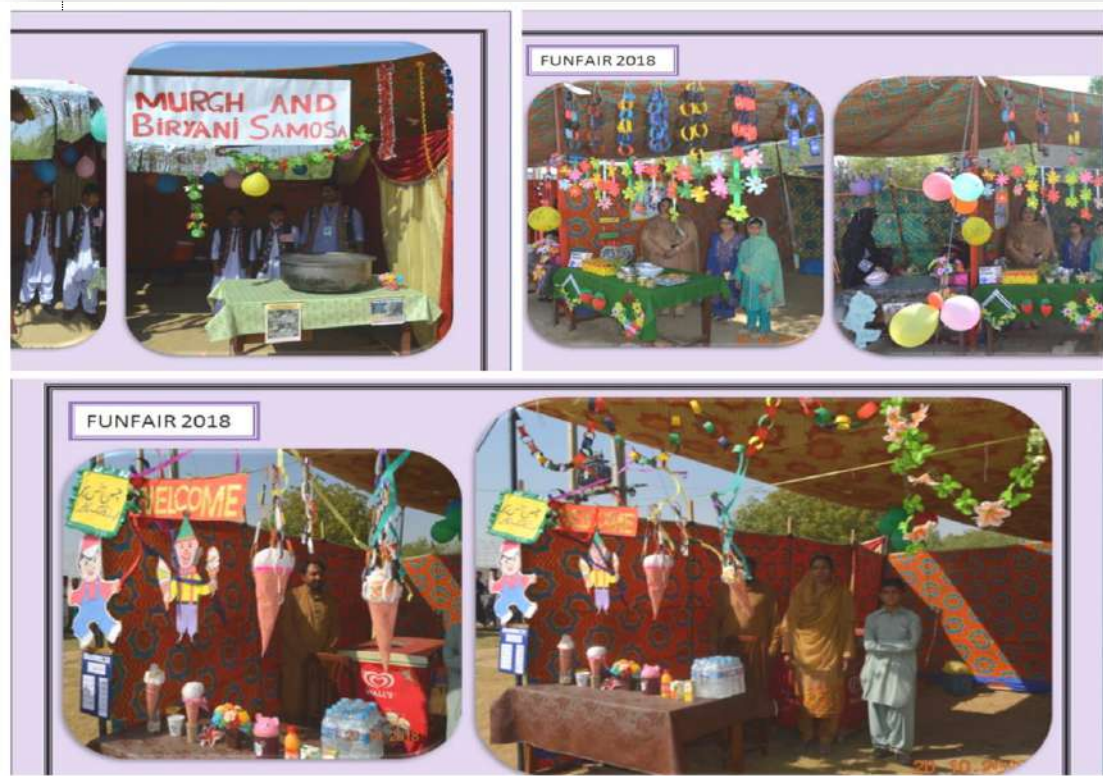


Figure 10 Funfair

communicated for the

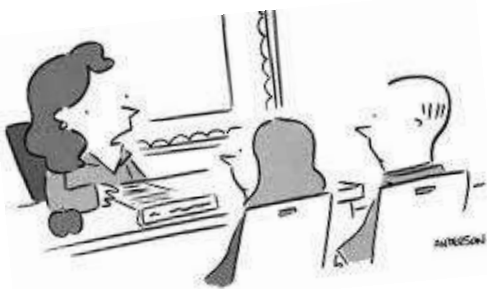
improvement of student's performance as a whole.

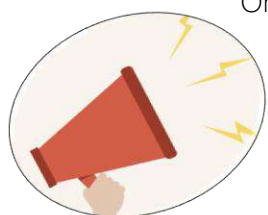
5.8. Visit of Chairman School Syndicate at TF Loralai
